Please take part - all we are looking for is the recipe for a grab-and-go dish that you may already be producing.

This is a great opportunity to share ideas and showcase the professionalism and diversity of our staff's skills, so please apply, encourage your staff to take part and show off your creativity.

Rules

Each Competitor will be invited to submit a paper recipe that will be paper judged based on the below criteria:

- Two portions of Street Food Style to your own specifications, this can be either fish based, meat based, or vegetarian based.
- Entries should include a good flair of taste, texture and colours
- Costings for the dish should not exceed £1.50 and these costings should be submitted along at the same time as the recipes
- Dishes should showcase their own authentic style served in a traditional style setting and in their own street style containers.

The shortlisted competitors will be asked to cook at the conference, starting 2pm and they will have approximately 45 mins to cook and serve the two dishes (one dish for tasting to the judges and one for photographing)

Only three finalists can cook on the day of the conference, so the closing date for entering this competition is 23rd February 2026 this is when the paper judging will take place, and the winning three entrees will be notified for them to cook and serve on the day of the conference.
